Mark their **feast day** in the calendar and find a way to celebrate them. Saint of the Day - learn more about the saints and ask for their intercession each day using the saint of day link in the accompanying resources on the website.

Hall of Faith - The Church has a beautiful tradition of creating icons, or holy pictures, which are images of religious figures and scenes.
