IDEAS FOR family prayer



Bless one another

Make the sign of the cross on your children's foreheads. Say "May the Lord bless and keep you" or a similar prayer.



Litany of Saints

Sing or say the names of various saints, followed by the words "Pray for us!" (Little ones can look at pictures of the saints or hold wooden saint dolls as you do this.)



Let the kids lead!

Ask one or all of the children to pick and lead a prayer, lead petitions, or collect/recite thanksgivings.



Sing

Choose a hymn to sing together. One verse is fine! Some options: Immaculate Mary, Hail Mary Gentle Woman, Salve Regina, Open My Eyes Lord, Holy God We Praise Thy Name...



Divine Mercy Chaplet

Pray or sing the Divine Mercy Chaplet - or even just one decade of it.



Read/reflect on Bible verse, saint quote, or Catechism passage
